Nancy Austin, Mr. Hammett Sanders, Misses and Mr. Sanders, Mrs. P. West, Ellen Jordan, Williams, West and James A. West, being sole heirs at law of James M. Austin late of Newville District, South Carolina, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two thousand Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by William Holderside Junior of Newville County in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William Holderside Junior all of our right, title and estate of, in or to all that plantation or tract of land situate, lying and being in Newville County, South Carolina, containing by old survey two hundred and six acres more or less, but by a survey running along a ditch instead of a creek, containing One hundred and ninety eight acres more or less the same being part of a tract of land of One hundred acres originally granted to Richard Brooks Roberts, sold by him to William Welch and by William Welch devised to his son William Welch Junior, who was his at law Elizabeth Wright conveyed the part therein described to James Jones, who conveyed the same on the tenth day of February 1826, James M. Austin, the same having the following courses and distances to wit: Beginning at Chestnut St. and running thence N 72 45 to a Red Oak St. thence N 57 20.50 to a Hickory St. thence S 53 E 68 to a Dog wood St. in the Branch of Rabun's Creek, thence down the meanders of said Creek to the beginning, bounded by lands at present of Ed Holderside, J. T. Bennett, James Asher, Starn and others and being the former residence and homestead of said James M. Austin, together with all and

singular the Rights, Menures, Accidents and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said William Holderside Junior his heirs and assigns forever. The intent hereby conveyed, being all of our right, title and interest in said tract of land, whether the same contains two hundred and six acres or one hundred and ninety eight acres, or more or less than either number. And We do hereby bind ourselves our heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Holderside Junior his heirs and assigns against ourselves and our heirs and all other persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same on any part thereof. Witness our Hands and seals this fifth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty four and in the One hundred and eighth year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
