This Indenture made and entered into this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty four between William Vance Mull of Transylvania County in the State of North Carolina of the first part, and R. J. McCarrill of the County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina of the second part Witnesseth: That the said William Vance Mull now aged nine years with the consent of his father George E. Mull hereon endorsed, do hereby of his own free will bind himself to serve the said party of the second part faithfully and diligently for the full term of twelve years from this date or until the said William Vance Mull shall have attained the age of twenty one years, during all which time the said William Vance Mull shall will and faithfully serve the said party of the second part in all such lawful business as the said party of the second part shall put to him, the said William Vance Mull, to the best of the power and ability of the said William Vance Mull, and that he will at all times behave himself honestly and obediently in said service, And it is hereby further covenanted and agreed by and between the said parties that in consideration of the said service to be rendered by the said party of the first part to the said party of the second part, the said party of the second part shall furnish and allow the said party of the first part suitable and sufficient board, meat, drink, clothing
