

Marion Dill, State of South Carolina
 Pol Deed. County of Greenville
 Elizabeth Henson, whereas, on the day of 1879 one
 James Henson, the father of Elizabeth Henson and of Marion
 Dill did deed to each of his two said children by sepa-
 rate deeds, one half of his tract of land containing
 two hundred and sixty acres; and whereas said
 deeds were duly executed by being signed, sealed and
 delivered in the presence of two subscribing witnesses,
 and whereas, after the execution of said deeds the
 said James Henson requested that he be allowed to
 hold said deeds until his death which request was
 acquiesced in and the deeds handed back to him by
 said parties; and whereas the said James Henson
 subsequent to the conveyance aforesaid, to wit: on the
 25th day of May, 1886, undertook by still another deed,
 to convey the whole of said land to the said Marion
 Dill; and whereas, the said James Henson did
 destroy the two first deeds above mentioned in the
 presence of the said Marion Dill; and whereas the
 said James Henson was mentally incompetent to
 make a binding contract at the time he executed
 the last mentioned deed to his said daughter and
 she does not wish, any way to take any advantage
 of her brother; Now know all men by these presents
 that I, Marion Dill of the State and County aforesaid
 in consideration of the Premises aforesaid and of
 five dollars, to me in hand paid by said Elizabeth
 Henson of the State and County aforesaid, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained
 sold and released and by these presents do grant,
 bargain, sell and release unto the said Elizabeth
 Henson all of that certain piece, parcel or tract of land
 situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville
 in the State aforesaid on Middle River containing
 One hundred and thirty acres, more or less and
 having the following notes and bounds to wit: Be-
 ginning at an Oak on the bank of Middle River
 and running thence in an Easterly direction to
 a Pecanue dead at the old home place thence in a
 North Easterly direction to John Campbell's line
 the North of the line thence with John Campbell's

to a Post Oak on the Middle River, thence with John Campbell's line South
 to a stake corner of William Henson and said John Campbell's
 line thence in a Westerly direction with William Henson's line
 to a stone, thence South with William Henson's line to a Pine,
 thence with said William Henson's line in an Easterly direction
 to a stone, thence in a straight line in a Southerly direction
 to the River, thence with the meanders of the River in a Westerly
 direction to John Henson's line to a Possumion Tree, thence
 in a Northerly direction to a Sour Wood, thence in a North-
 Westerly direction to a Post Oak on John Henson's line, thence
 in a Southerly direction to a Sour Wood, thence in a Westerly
 direction to a Red Oak on John Henson's line, thence in the
 same direction with John Henson's line to a Willow, thence
 with the meanders of the River to the beginning corner. It being
 the same tract deeded to said Elizabeth Henson by James
 Henson on the day of 1879, and being one half
 of the whole tract originally owned by said James Henson
 together with all and singular the rights, members, here-
 ditaments and appurtenances to the said premises be-
 longing, or in anywise incident or appertaining, to
 have and to hold all and singular the said premises
 before mentioned unto the said Elizabeth Henson, his heirs
 and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my
 heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and
 forever defend all and singular the said premises
 unto the said Elizabeth Henson, his heirs and assigns
 against me and my heirs and against every per-
 son whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim
 the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and
