

held against him by Dr. E. J. S. Rowley as trustee for his mother, and judgments or mortgage due to some party in New York, together with such interest as may be due on each, the Rowley judgment being about the sum of Three Thousand Dollars and interest and the judgment or mortgage in New York being about the sum Twenty-five hundred dollars and interest; and also to pay all expenses which they may be at in the execution of, and carrying out this power of this power of attorney and all expenses incurred by them in the execution thereof, for attorney's fees, traveling expenses and all other necessary expenses, hereby giving and granting to our said attorneys full power and authority to do anything whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done in the premises, as fully as we could do if personally present; with full power of substitution and revocation hereby ratifying and confirming all that our said attorneys or their substitutes shall lawfully or lawfully to be done by virtue hereof.
