I agree to lease to J. W. Clemmons my place in Fairview
Township for the years of 1900-1901-1902. The same being
for agricultural purposes. I also agree that all machinery
put up by J. W. Clemmons shall be his property and
should I not desire to purchase same at the separation
of this lease said Clemmons shall have the right
to remove same from the premises. I also agree that
said J. W. Clemmons shall have a right to clear
any land he may desire and to use the wood for
any purposes he may desire.

and to pay all taxes and expenses.

State of South Carolina) Know all men by these
presents that I John D. Babb, being owner of the
fee unencumbered by any mortgage, judgement or other
lien of a certain tract of land, situate, lying and being
in the state and county aforesaid in Butler Township
about Two (2) miles from the city of Greenville S. C. contain-
ing One acre more or less and having the following outer
bounds, viz - Beginning at a stone about 50 feet from
the S. E. corner of the Distillery building running thence
South 210 feet to a Rock, thence East 210 feet to a
small black oak, thence N 210 feet to a stake in a pile
of rocks, thence West 210 feet to the beginning corner,
containing one acre more or less and bounded on all sides
by lands of John D. Babb. And I do hereby consent that
the said premises may be used by J. P. Goodwin
for the purpose of distilling of spirits, subject to the provision
of law this consent to exist for a term of one year from
Jan 1st 1900. And I do hereby stipulate and agree that the
Government of the United States for taxes and penalties shall
have priority of all my right title and interest in said
tract of land or any claim in my behalf and that in
case of forfeiture of said premises or any part thereof the title
to the same shall rest in the United States
