Estes and Johanna Bonnemeyer, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, and forever quit claim and relinquish unto the said Ann Bonnemeyer, Ellen B. Estes and Johanna Bonnemeyer all my right, title, interest, estate, claim and demand whatsoever, whether at law or in equity, of, in or to the following property, First: all that certain lot piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the First Ward of the City of Greenville, in said State and County, having a frontage of 96 feet on North Street and 50 feet on Laurens Street, being the same conveyed to said Henry Bonnemeyer by Lewis W. Parker, by deed bearing date February 26, 1897, and recorded in said office on March 1, 1897, in Deed Book "C 6 C" at page 673;

Second: all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in said County and State, about one and a quarter miles North of the City of Greenville; bounded on the North and East by lands formerly belonging to J. Hahn, on the South by lands of Stone, and on the West by lands of Garvin; containing two and one tenth (2 1/10) acres, more or less, and being the same land conveyed to said Henry Bonnemeyer by said J. Hahn, by deed bearing date February 14, 1873, and recorded in said office on February 18, 1873, in Deed Book "E 6", at page 386 (the said Henry Bonnemeyer having died seized and possessed of said two tracts of land);

Third: all other property, real or personal, of every description, wheresoever situate, of which the said Henry Bonnemeyer died seized or possessed, or to which he was in any manner entitled; Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said Ann Bonnemeyer, Ellen B. Estes and Johanna Bonnemeyer, and their heirs and assigns forever.
