and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John
G. Durham, Lot No. 115 of Springwood Cemetery, having the following
dimensions, to wit; E. 10 feet, N. 11 1/2 feet, N. 16, S. 16 containing
of Circle, for the right of burial and cemetery purposes, and to be used
exclusively for the right and purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions
of the charter of said Grantor, and all revisions thereof and amendments that may
be made thereon, and also subject to the Ordinances of said City, and the rules,
regulations and by-laws of the City Council and Cemetery Trustees or Committee,
now in force, or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said Cemetery and
the burial of the dead therein. Together with all and singular the Rights, Members,
Hereditaments and Appurtenances to said premises belonging, or in anywise
incident or appertaining. To Have and to Hold, all and singular the said
Premises before mentioned, unto the said Maria G. Durham, his heirs
and assigns forever; Subject, however, to the limitations and conditions

State of South Carolina:

Whereas, John Adams, departed this life in 1892,
possessed of the tract of land herein after described, and leaving of force his

children of a predeceased daughter Ellen Harrison, being devisees under said will of
the State aforesaid, in consideration of the premises and in consideration of the sum
of Five Dollars, to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by John H. Payne (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained,
sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto
the said John H. Payne that certain tract of land situate in Greenville County
in said State on Reedy River, with following lines and courses: - Beginning
at a black gum 3x, thence N. 64 W. 11.00 to rock corner 3x, thence N. 30 W. 53.50 to
rock 3x, thence N. 50 E. 23.50 to rock pile, thence S. 25 E. 4, thence N. 50 E. 18.50 to
stake on River, thence along Reedy River to Maple 3x, thence along said River to
and including dog shoals and an elbow of said stream to R. O. 3x, thence to the
beginning. Being lands formerly of John Adams deceased, and fully described in a
certain deed from W. A. Adams and R. K. Adams as Executors of said John Adams
to John H. Payne.
