NOW KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS; That the said Saluda Oil Mill, in pursuance of the power vested in it under and by virtue of the resolution aforesaid, and in consideration of the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars, and other valuable consideration to it in hand well and truly paid by the Anderson Phosphate and Oil Company, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Anderson Phosphate and Oil Company, its successors and assign the entire physical plant and real estate of Saluda Oil Mill, with tools, machinery and appliances, whether put up or not, including one roll of press cloth, and all and every other adjunct to, and part of said real and physical property, including especially therein, All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land containing Twenty, onehundredth (20/100) of an acre, more or less, situate and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of said Saluda Oil Mill hereinafter conveyod, and adjoining lands of Piedmont Manufacturing Company and S.F. Trowbridge. Beginring at a stake X.3 on road and running thence S.1 1/4 W.3.18 with line of said Saluda 0il Mill land to a stone X.3, thence N.81 E.50 links to a stone X.3, thence N.7 1/4 E 3.26 to an iron stake x.3, thence S.81 W.83 links to the beginning corner.
