AND WHEREAS, The said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is Sons and Daughters of Hopo.

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville County, S.C.

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is to care for the sick and bury the dead.

FIFTH. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers, are as follows: President, Wm.M. Blassingame; Vice President, S.J. Franks; Secretary, Louvinia Hawthorne; Treasurer, Mary Scott; Chaplain, Hime Mays; Speaker, E.W. Brown; Trustees- Geo. Scott, Wm. Hawthorne and John W. Reed.

SIXTH. That they desired to be incorporated in puptuity.

Now, Therefore, I, M.R. COOPER, Secretary of State, by virtue of authority in me vested do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities conferred by an Act of the General Assembly of South Carolina entitled: "An Act to provide for the Incorporation of Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal or Charitable Churches, Lodges, Societies, Associations, or Companies, and for amending the Charters of those already formed and to be formed", approved February 19, A.D. 1900, and other provisions of law.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the State, at Columbia, this 21st. day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred two and in the one hundred and twenty-seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America.

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Partition Agreement

between V.E. McBee, F.B. McBee, M.P. Landrum and L.M. Briggs.

Know all men by these presents, That whereas Mrs. H.B. McBee of the City of Greenville, State and County aforesaid, (she being the widow of W.P. McBee, now deceased) having had possession of certain Real Estate, known as the W.P. McBee Homestead, situate lying and being in the City of Greenville, State and County aforesaid, and whereas the said Mrs. H.B. McBee died on the 14th. day of March A.D. 1901, leaving surviving her, four children, viz, F.B. McBee, V.E. McBee, M.P. Landrum and L.M. Briggs, all of whom having attained their majority, do hereby agree and by these presents has

agreed each with the other, that the lots of land which have been selected, or set off to us, or them respectively, according to the appraised valuation and a plat which was made on the 16th. day of May A.D. 1902, by J.N. Southern, D.S. and marked exhibit A, the same is hereby declared by each and every one of us, to be the one which shall govern us in the selection of lots so chosen, or selected in the partition of the Real Estate of the said W.P. McBee, deceased, as devised by his will bearing date the 1st. day of October A.D. 1860.

And that we the said F.B. McBee, V.E. McBee, M.P. Landrum and L.M. Briggs, do hereby consent and by these presents have consented, that such lots of land as may have been selected, or set off to us in a friendly partition which we have made each with the other, confirming the acts and deeds of the others, and the lots so selected or set off respectively by, or to us shall be doled to the respective parties so selecting, according to the said plat, and that the deeds so made each to the other, shall conform to the metes and bounds of the said plat, and the party failing or refusing to be governed by the selection, or partition agreed on by us in a friendly way, shall pay, or cause to be paid to the others, or their legal representative, the full and just sum of One hundred Dollars, and it is further agreed by and between us, that the deeds may be made to the said party, or parties, to whom they have been partitioned, or set off to, at once,
