THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

By the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, T.O. Lawton, T. Oregon Lawton, Jr., and W.T. Bull of the city of Greenville, S.C. did on the 9th. day of October, 1903, file with the Secretary of State a Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

- First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as aforesaid given. Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of Oregon Lumber Company. Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville, S.C. Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business proposed to do is buying, making, manufacturing, owning, controlling, and acquiring in any manner, selling and in any wise disposing of goods, wares and merchandise pertaining to or used in connection with buildings, structures, machines, fixtures, movables, and all other things that are or are to be constructed and constructed things and articles, including coal, wood, oil & other things, and also to make contracts for fixing, erecting, placing and using such goods, wares and merchandise, and to exercise generally and fully all powers conferred by law upon business corporations. Fifth: The amount of the capital stock to be Five Thousand Dollars and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be Fifty of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth by the charter. AND WHEREAS, on October 9th. 1903 the date above named petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators.

AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the Oct. 15th. 1903 did file with the Secretary of State to be returned in writing, over their signature, setting forth, among other things, that pursuant to published notice as required in the commission of the said Corporators, the books of subscription to the capital stock of the aforesaid company were duly opened and that thereupon exceeding fifty per centum of the capital stock was subscribed by bona fide stockholders; that thereupon a meeting of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers, and furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina, of 1902, and all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J.T. Gantt, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter, and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
