(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain,
sell and release unto the said Frances Lucy Ellington and Daniel Ellington,
all that piece parcel and tract of land situate lying and
being in Greenville Township, in the County and State aforesaid
about one-fourth of a mile beyond the east limits of the
City of Greenville, containing forty 40 acres, more or less, adjoining
lands of W. P. Vaughan, Mrs. M. J. Howell, Riley Rowley, and others
by miles and bounds, courses and distances described land
may be more accurately described in accordance with the plan
of W. A. Hudson, made September 10, 1905, as follows: Beginning
at a stone in the Lourus Hill Road and running thence N. 55° E.
16.75 to a stone thence N. 24° W. 20.00 to a stone; thence S. 48° W. 22.20
to an iron pin, thence S. 36° E. 4.00 to a stone, thence S. 48° W. 3.20
to a stone thence S. 36° E. 7.0 to a stone in the Lourus Hill
Road, thence S. 86° E. 1.33 to a bend crossing branch, thence S. 67°
E. 2.16 to a bend thence S. 86° E. 5.00 to the beginning stone,

And I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Frances Lucy Ellington and
Daniel Ellington, their

Heirs and Assigns, against myself, my and my Heirs, and against every
person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
