(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Paschal A. King,

All that piece of land situate lying and being in Greenville County, South Carolina, on the road to Spartanburg and Batesville, about five miles from Greenville Court House, containing forty three acres, more or less, and having the following lines, Metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stake 3x0 and running thence N. 32 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 21.20 to a stone 3x0, thence along the public road S. 80 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 26.50 to a P. O. (post) stake 3x0, thence S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 10.00 to a stake 3x0, thence N. 43 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 3.17 to a stone 3x0, thence S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 6.34 to a stone 3x0, thence N. 43 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 3.17 to a stone 3x0, thence S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 8.00 to two Maples on bank of creek, thence down the meanders of the Creek to the beginning; Being a part of a tract of land containing One hundred acres, which was conveyed by Martin L. Patrick by C. E. Brunet on the seventeenth day of September A. D. 1881, and recorded in Register, Deed Conveyance office, Greenville County, S. C. t. 1 l. 100.

The above described tract of land being the same devised to us by Will, of John B. Patrick Deceased said Will being on record in Judge of Probate's Office, Anderson County, State of South Carolina.

And we do hereby bind ourselves our Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Paschal A. King.

Heirs and Assigns, against us and our Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
