bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a stone 3XOM, near a large Double poplar tree, and running thence
N. 72-3/4 W. 5.76 chs. to a stone 3Xom on branch near a large rock; thence with the meandering
of said branch to South Tyger River; thence down the meanders of said river to a stone 3XOM
at the old run of the river; thence up the old run 3.00 chs. to a stone 3XOM; thence N. 1
W. 5.67 chs. to a sweet gum tree 3XOM; thence N. 64-3/4 E. 17.50 chs. to a sweet gum bush
3XNM; thence N. 46-3/8 E. 8.50 chs. to a sweet gum tree on branch 3XNM; thence N. 66 E.
17.00 chs. to a white oak and stone (stone gone); thence N. 59 E. 13.63 chs. to a stone
