All that certain piece parcel or tract of land lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina and on the branch of Laurel Creek about three miles north East of Greenville Court House and on the south side of Pike's Road with the following metes and bounds:
Beginning at a rock on William Goldsmith's corner, thence N. 19 1/2 E. 3.51 chains to rock on north side of what is called Pike Road, thence along said road 11 chains to a rock, thence S. 12 1/2 W. 22.75 chains to a rock in the old field, thence N. 77 1/2 W. 10.91 chs. to a stake on William Goldsmith's line thence N. 12 1/2 E. 17.20 chs. to beginning corner, containing twenty-five acres (25) more or less.
