with interest thereon, from date at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, to be
computed and paid semi-annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof,
who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

ten per cent on the amount due besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or
any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference

bargain, sell and release unto the said James McPherson: All that piece, parcel or lot of land in the

City of Greenville in the County and State aforesaid on the southeast corner of
Dunbar and Calhoun Streets, and being composed of the northern portions of Lots #1
and #2 on a plat of the Irvine land which is recorded in R.M.C. Office for said
County in Plat Book "A" at page 163; the lot hereby mortgaged having the following lines:
Beginning at the southeast corner of Dunbar and Calhoun Streets, and running thence
along Dunbar Street S. 76 E. one hundred feet, more or less to a stake; thence in a
line parallel to Calhoun Street S. 18 W. one hundred feet to a stake; thence in a line
