

December 15, 1890, and recorded in said office on December 27, 1890, in Deed Book "XX" at page 309; and by the said John R. Campbell reconveyed to the said William Reid, by deed bearing date October 18, 1897, and recorded in said office on October 28th, 1903, in Deed Book "HHH" at page 749; and by the said William Reid conveyed to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date October 1, 1903, and recorded in said office on October 28th, 1903, in Deed Book "JJJ" at page 898.

6. Also, that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on waters of North Saluda River, comprising several separate tracts of land and containing, in the aggregate, three hundred and twenty-two and one-third ($322 \frac{1}{3}$) acres, more or less. A portion of this land is a tract which was conveyed as four hundred and thirty-seven (437) acres by Joshua Lindsay to Charles A. Gosnell, by certain metes and bounds which are fully set forth in a deed executed by the said Joshua Lindsay, bearing date February 3, 1881, recorded in said office Nov. 27, 1888, in Deed Book "UU," at page 534. From this 437 acre tract the said Charles A. Gosnell conveyed a certain portion containing two hundred and eighteen (218) acres, to Joshua Gosnell, by deed bearing date June 4, 1883, and recorded in said office on Nov. 10, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," at page 21; said deed fully describing said portion conveyed to said Joshua Gosnell; this leaving said Charles A. Gosnell still vested with the title to two hundred and nineteen (219) acres of the said Joshua Lindsay tract. Another portion of this land being a tract which was conveyed to the said Charles A. Gosnell by the late Lemuel N. Wilcox, by deed bearing date Dec. 4, 1890, and recorded in said office on Nov. 2, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," at page 12; said tracts having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by J. D. Norman, surveyor, which plat was delivered by the said Charles A. Gosnell to me, the said R. E. Johnston, and is herewith delivered; said plat bearing date the first day of February, 1894, to-wit: Beginning at a stake or stone on the old Middleton line, and running thence S. 30 W. 21.50 chains to a hickory; thence S. 40 E., crossing North Saluda River, 37.25 chains to a chestnut oak in Brushy Hill Gap; thence S. $50 \frac{2}{3}$ W. 27.90 chains to an old chestnut stump; thence S. $37 \frac{1}{2}$ E. 11.75 chains to a poplar; thence S. $63 \frac{1}{2}$ E. 5.72 chains to a large chestnut; thence N. 87 W. 6.21 chains to a stone; thence S. 35 W. 8.00 chains to a stone; thence N. 45 W. 22.50 chains to a hickory; thence N. $14 \frac{1}{2}$ E. 11.50 chains to a black gum; thence N. $14 \frac{1}{2}$ E. 9.00 chains to a poplar; thence N. 16 W. 14.00 chains to a stone; thence N. 14 E. crossing North Saluda River, 6.00 chains to a hickory; thence N. 18 W. 20.00 chains to a chestnut oak on the old corner of the "Big Survey" and the Middleton land; thence N. 36 E. 10.00 chains to the beginning corner; containing one hundred and forty-five (145) acres, more or less. The remainder of said land is a tract conveyed to the said Charles A. Gosnell by Peter Gosnell, by deed bearing date March 3, 1888, and recorded in said office on November 30, 1888, in Deed Book "UU," at page 533, wherein said land is described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a stake on the north side of North Saluda River, on the old line between Peter Gosnell and Charles A. Gosnell, and running thence nearly north down the branch to said river; thence nearly west over a little bluff to a stake on the branch; thence nearly north up said branch to the cliff; thence nearly east to a stake on the Charles A. Gosnell old line; thence nearly south with said line to the beginning stake; containing five (5) acres, more or less. The said Charles A. Gosnell thereafter executed to me, the said R. E. Johnston, deed bearing date November 3, 1903, and recorded in said office on November 12, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," page 26, whereby he conveyed to me the said three tracts of 219 acres, 145 acres and 5 acres, respectively, aggregating 369 acres; whereupon I, the said R. E. Johnston, did thereupon execute a deed bearing date November 10, 1903, and recorded in said office on Nov. 13, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," page 31, reconveying to the said Charles A. Gosnell three tracts of the cleared portions of said 369 acres, as follows: a tract of 25 acres, a tract of 5 acres, and a tract of $16 \frac{1}{3}$ acres, more or less, aggregating $46 \frac{1}{3}$ acres, more or less; thus leaving the title to the remaining $322 \frac{2}{3}$ acres, more or less, vested in me, the said R. E. Johnston, and intended to be conveyed by the present deed; the description contained in all the various deeds hereinabove mentioned are hereby adopted as a part of the description herein.

7. Also, that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on waters of North Saluda River, adjoining the tract of land last above described and lands of Wm. H. Irvine, et al, containing one hundred and eighteen (118) acres, more or less; this being a portion of the tract hereinbefore mentioned as having been conveyed by Charles A. Gosnell to Joshua Gosnell, by deed bearing date June 4, 1883, and recorded in said office on Nov. 10, 1903, in Deed Book "LL," at page 21, wherein said tract so conveyed is described as containing two hundred and eighteen (218) acres, more or less; said Joshua Gosnell having conveyed one hundred (100) acres of said land to W. R. Morgan, by deed dated Sept. 7, 1898, and recorded in said office on Sept. 28, 1898, in Deed Book "FFF," at page 121; the remaining one hundred and eighteen (118) acres of said land having been conveyed by the said Joshua Gosnell to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date Nov. 10, 1903, and recorded in said office on Nov. 12, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," page 27; but from the said tract of 118 acres there has been reconveyed to me, the said R. E. Johnston, to the said Joshua Gosnell a certain portion of the cleared land, containing eighteen (18) acres, more or less, on which is situate the dwelling house of said Joshua Gosnell; the said cleared land being around and adjacent to the dwelling house, in one unbroken tract or body, marked by the present boundaries of the cleared land; the deed of conveyance from myself to the said Joshua Gosnell for the said 18 acres bearing date November 10, 1903, and recorded in said office on Nov. 13, 1903, in Deed Book "LLL," page 30; so that by the present deed I only intend to convey to said Border State Lumber Company the remaining one hundred (100) acres of said land.
