Harrison, Jr.

have hand well and truly paid by the said The Prudential Insurance Company of America, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said The Prudential Insurance Company of America, the following described real estate, to-wit:

All of that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, lying, being and situate in Fairview Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point marking the extreme southeastern corner of the within described tract, which point marks corner with lands now or formerly owned by Jim Henderson and Henry Harrison, and which point is in the center of the Jenkins Bridge Road; thence along the center of said road with the following calls: N. 54-1/4° E. 12.36 chs. to a stone; thence N. 87° E. 3.72 chs. to a stone; thence leaving said road, N. 33-1/2° W. 34.80 chs. to a post oak; thence N. 60-2° W. 6.45 chs. to a stone; thence N. 60-1/4° W. 5 chs. to a stone; thence N. 87-2° W. 51.61 chs. to a point in the center of a branch; thence along said branch as the same meanders in a general southwesterly direction 7 chs. to a point; thence leaving said branch S. 60-1/4° E. 44.65 chs. to a stone; thence S. 60-2° E. 40.80 chs. to the point and place of beginning; said tract containing 191 acres, according to survey made by C.A.
