WHEREAS, I, the said *W. R. Moore* in and by *my* certain *Promissary* note in writing, of even date with these presents, *am* well and truly indebted to

*Alexander Finley* in the full and just sum of *Twelve hundred and no/100 (1200.00)* Dollars, to be paid *Two years after date*

with interest thereon, from *Oct 24 1929* at the rate of *6* per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid *December 1st. of each year*

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of

besides all costs and expenses of collection to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.)

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said *W. R. Moore* in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said *Alexander Finley* according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to *me*, the said *W. R. Moore* in hand well and truly paid by the said *Alexander Finley*

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *Alexander Finley*

all that certain tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in Chick Springs Township Greenville County, S.C., containing one hundred two and one-half (102-1/2) acres more or less, and having according to Survey made by S. G. Statson, Surveyor, November 22nd, 1888, the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at a stake on Brushy Creek, corner of land now or formerly owned by J. L. Freeman and running thence N. 75-2, E. 7.00 chains to a rock; thence N. 18 2/3, E. 8.00 to a rock; thence N. 72 E. 9.40 chains to rock; thence N. 20 2/3, E. 8.00 chains to stake; thence N. 3-1/2, E. 6.30 chains to H. C. Stamp; thence N. 18 2/3, H. 30 to post oak; thence N. 5 E. 5.00 chains to stake; thence S. 84 2/3, E. 28 chains to stake in branch; thence down the meanders of said branch 34.30 chains to stake in Brushy Creek, mouth of said branch; thence down the meanders of Brushy Creek in a South-easterly direction to the point of beginning and being the same land devised to me by my Grand-father, William Moore, as will appear by his will filed in the Probate Judges Office for Greenville County in Apartment No. 44, file 16, April 20th 1931.
