until paid in full. all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or  
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who  
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of reasonable amount  
besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be

and Thomas Stenhouse, their heirs and assigns forever, all that  
certain piece, parcel, lot or tract of land, lying, situate and  
being in Jarnew Township, Greenville County, S. C. contain-  
ing 64 acres, more or less, and being known and desig-  
nated as tract no. 1 of the Mrs. Janet S. Stenhouse prop-  
erty, according to plat of E. E. Fry, Surveyor, Oct 2, 1926,  
and having the following metes and bounds;  
Beginning at a stake in Ruby Ferry Road, and  
running thence N. 41 1/2 W. 27.65 to a point in said road;
