And the said mortgagor agree to insure the house and buildings on said lot in a sum not less than Twelve Hundred Dollars, in a company or companies satisfactory to the mortgagee and keep the same insured from loss or damage by fire, and assign the policy of insurance to the said mortgagee, and that in the event that the mortgagor shall at any time fail to do so, then the said mortgagee may cause the same to be insured in his name and reimburse himself
