Now, Know All Men, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt and for better securing the payment thereof to the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following-described real estate situated in the County of Greenville State of South Carolina: in Greenville Township, on the Western corner of Franklin Road and Grove Street, near the City of Greenville, being shown as lot No. 28 on Plat of McCullough Heights, recorded in Plat Book E at Page 95, and according to a more recent survey prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service March 1, 1950, is described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin at the Northwest corner of Franklin Road and Grove Street and running thence with Franklin Road, S. 45-26 W. 60 feet to an iron pin, joint front corner of lots Nos. 28 and 29; thence with joint line of said lots, N. 44-20 W. 164 feet to an iron pin in the South side of a 10 foot alley; thence with said alley, N. 45-26 E. 60 feet to an iron pin in the West side of Grove Street; thence with said street, S. 44-20 E. 164 feet to the point of beginning.
