MORTGAGE OF REAL ESTATE

COUNTY OF Greenville

To All Whom These Presents May Concern:

We, Irene M. Bragg and P. C. Bragg

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIRST FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION OF GREENVILLE, SOUTH CAROLINA (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) in the full and just sum of

Five Thousand Eight Hundred and no/100----- (\$ 5,800.00) Dollars, as evidenced by Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, said note to be repaid with interest at the rate

therein specified in installments of Sixty-five and 13/100----- (\$ 65.13) Dollars each on the first day of each month hereafter, in advance, until the principal sum with interest has been paid in full, such payments to be applied first to the payment of interest, computed monthly on unpaid principal balances, and then to the payment of principal with the last payment, if not sooner paid, to be due and payable 10 years after date; and

WHEREAS, said note further provides that if at any time any portion of the principal or interest due thereunder shall be past due and unpaid for a period of thirty days, or if there shall be any failure to comply with and abide by any By-Laws or the Charter of the Mortgagee, or any stipulations set out in this mortgage, the whole amount due thereunder shall, at the option of the holder thereof become immediately due and payable, and said holder shall have the right to institute any proceedings upon said note and any collaterals given to secure same, for the purpose of collecting said principal due, and interest, with costs and expenses for such proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to the Mortgagor's account for the payment of taxes, insurance premiums, repairs, or for any other purpose,

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of said debt and to secure the payment thereof and any further sums which may be advanced by the Mortgagee to the Mortgagor's account, and also in consideration of the sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in the City of Greenville, on the southwestern side of Fore Avenue and known and designated as Lot No. 12, Block F of a subdivision known as East Highland Estates, plat of which is recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book K at Page 36, and according to said plat has the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the southwestern side of Fore Avenue at the joint front corner of Lots Nos. 11 and 12 and running thence with Lot 11 S. 83-34 W. 170.4 feet to an iron pin on the eastern edge of a five foot strip of land reserved for utilities; running thence with the eastern side of said five foot strip N. 28-13 W. 79 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with said strip N. 32-0 W. 87.8 feet to an iron pin on the southern side of a six foot screen area; running thence with the southern side of said screen area S. 71-38 E. 184.7 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with said screen area S. 68-38 E. 54.4 feet to an iron pin on the southwestern side of Fore Avenue; running thence with the southwestern side of said avenue S. 35-30 E. 62 feet to an iron pin, point of beginning.
