

And I the said mortgagor, agree(s) to insure the house and buildings on said land for not less than ~~Thirty-Four Thousand, Six Hundred and No/100~~ (\$ 34,600.00) Dollars. in a company or companies which shall be acceptable to the mortgagee, and keep the same insured from loss or damage by fire or other casualty, by extended coverage, during the continuation of this mortgage, and make loss under the policy or policies of insurance payable to the mortgagee, and that in the event I shall at any time fail to do so, then the said mortgagee may cause the same to be insured as above provided, and be reimbursed for the premium and expense of such insurance under this mortgage. Upon failure of the mortgagor to pay any insurance premium, taxes, other public assessment, or any part thereof, the mortgagee may, at his option, declare the full amount of this mortgage due and payable.

PROVIDED ALWAYS, NEVERTHELESS, and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties to these presents, that if I the said mortgagor, do and shall well and truly pay, or cause to be paid unto the said mortgagee the said debt or sum of money aforesaid, with interest thereon, if any shall be due, according to the true intent and meaning of the said note, then this deed of bargain and sale shall cease, determine, and be utterly null and void; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

AND IT IS AGREED, by and between the said parties, that I, the mortgagor, am to hold and enjoy the said premises until default of payment shall be made.

And if at any time any part of said debt, interest, taxes or fire insurance premiums thereon, be past due and unpaid, I hereby, without notice or further proceedings, assign the rents and profits of the above described premises to the said mortgagee, or its SUCCESSORS, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns (provided the premises herein described are occupied by a tenant), and should said premises be occupied by the mortgagor, its successors, Assigns, may apply to any Judge of the Circuit Court of said State, at chambers or otherwise, or to any Judge of the County Court in any County which has a County Court, for the appointment of a receiver, with authority to take possession of said premises and collect said rents and profits, applying the net proceeds (after paying the cost of collection) upon said debt, interest, costs and expenses without liability to account for anything more than the rents and profits actually collected.
