All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter to be constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville and lying and being on the eastern side of Weehawken Circle and being known and designated as Lot No. 13 according to a plat entitled Weehawken Hills Subdivision, said plat being dated November 10, 1970 and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Plat Book 4F at Page 50 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
