

The petitioner and respondent were examined, both by their attorneys and by the Court, as to their understanding of the original agreement, dated October 10, 1980, and Supplemental Agreements 1 and 2. Both parties stated to the Court that they clearly understood the terms of said agreements and they further advised the Court that they consider the agreements to be fair and equitable as to all issues arising out of their marital relationship and they further requested of the Court that the Court approve same as a full and complete property settlement between them. The parties further testified that they were completely satisfied with the services of their respective attorneys. The petitioner submitted a support determination form for the Court's consideration and the Court examined the respondent as to her relative financial condition. Upon considering the terms of the agreement, as modified in Supplemental Agreements 1 and 2, and considering the relative financial condition and contributions of the parties, the Court finds that the aforesaid agreements constitute a full and complete and final property settlement agreement between these parties and that said agreements are fair and equitable to both parties and that both parties fully and completely understand the terms and the ramifications of said agreements. The Court finds and so holds that all of the terms of said agreement, as modified in Supplemental Agreements 1 and 2, shall herewith become the Order of this Court.

The Court further examined the parties and the attorneys with respect to whether or not there was a possibility of reconciliation. Both parties indicated to the Court that they did not feel that a reconciliation was possible and both attorneys advised the Court that they had counseled with the parties and concurred in that opinion.

The Court finds that the parties have, in fact, been living separate and apart, without cohabitation, for more than one year and that the petitioner is entitled to a divorce from the respondent on said grounds. Having so found, the petitioner is hereby granted a divorce absolute from the respondent on the

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
