To Transport goods, merchandise, and passengers upon land and water. To make, produce, buy, handle, use, deal, and traffic in, sell and otherwise dispose of, all kinds of agricultural products, foods, beaverages, drugs, furniture, machinery, tools, supplies, goods, wares, merchandise, and manufacturies. To apply for, obtain, register, acquire, use, give licenses under and dispose of, right in respect, to manufacture, use, business or trade, including inventions, processes, patents, trade marks and trade names.
