Harrison and J.I. West, as Administrators of the Estate of J. Edward Harrison, deceased and John H. Harrison.

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 22nd, day of June 1911, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a decree of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be sold by J.W. Gray, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate for sale by public outcry on the 4th, day of December in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eleven did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auction, sell and dispose of the same unto Robert Harrison

for the sum of Ten Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder therefor. NOW, THEREFORE, Know all men by these Presents, that I, J.W. Gray Master in and for County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars, to me paid by the said Robert Harrison

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert Harrison, all the one-third undivided interest in that certain lot or parcel of land situate in Fairview Township, County and State aforesaid on Reedy River, containing three acres, more or less, and known as the Harrison Mill tract, having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at a stone X and running; thence N. 69 W. 4.60 chains to stake; thence N. 21 E. crossing river 7.80 chains to a stone; thence S. 69 E. 4.60 chains to a pine; thence S. 21 W. passing an iron tree on bank of River 7.80 chains to a stone X at the beginning corner.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or by these or any of them.
