D. Davis for Three Hundred & Eighty Dollars being at that price the highest bidder for same.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Walter M. Scott

as Judge of the Court of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of 380.00 DOLLARS, paid me by the said H. D. Davis the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. HAVE granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, DO grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said H. D. Davis and his heirs and assigns forever, ALL

that piece parcel or part of land containing about three acres in the northern section of Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the waters of Pine Creek and Cobden Creek: Beginning at a stake on Petersburg Road and running thence with said road to B. J. Curry's line on road leading from Pine Station to H. H. Garrison's place with B. J. Curry's line and said road to the line of J. M. Crooke line to the beginning.

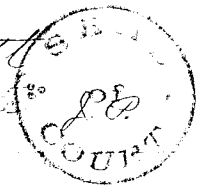
