TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME OR BE MADE KNOWN, or whom the same may in anywise concern, I, Fannie C. Scott, as Judge of the Court of Probate for Greenville County, in the said State, SEND GREETING:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Fannie C. Scott as Judge of the Court of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of \$1840.00 DOLLARS, paid me by the said A. Y. Willis the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged.

HAVE granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, DO grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said A. Y. Willis and his heirs and assigns forever, ALL That certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Bates Township, State and County aforesaid, containing thirty-six (36) more or less, and adjoining lands of A. F. Jordan, Jr., O. N. Jordan the White Horse Road, and others.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and the remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said

A. F. Jordan, deceased and of all the parties to the said suit, and of all other persons rightfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, by, from or under them, or either of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises with its hereditaments, privileges and appurtenances unto the said A. Y. Willis and his Heirs and Assigns forever.
