F.D. Suber, all that piece, parcel and lot of land situate, lying and being in the County and State aforesaid, in Grove Township, near the Town of Piedmont on the west side of the road from Piedmont to Greenville, and bounded on the east by said road; on the north by lands of F.D. Suber; on the South by Will Nesbitt, and on the West by the lands of the Piedmont Company, said lot now containing one acre, more or less, being the same lot of land conveyed to Mrs. S.J. Ashmore by Mary E. Bates and Joseph A. Bates, Jr., by deed dated March 11, 1909 and recorded in Book Vol. 4, page 179, records R.M.C. Office Greenville County - Less one acre heretofore sold by Mrs. Ashmore and now owned by Will Nesbitt.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same; and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or any of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said F.D. Suber, his heirs and assigns forever.
