 NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, Nannie Woodson & Annie Jordan
 in the State aforesaid,
 in consideration of the sum of Five hundred DOLLARS,
 to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Henry F. Woodson

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these Presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said Henry F. Woodson all our right, title, and undivided interest, same being two-tenths interest in, of and to all that piece, parcel or tract of land lying being and situate in Durbin Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on Rocky Fork branch waters of Saluda river, containing fifty-two and one-half acres.
 Beginning at a stone at the road and running thence N. 6 W. 30.50 chains to a stone in the road where Rocky Fork crosses said road, thence the road line to a stone in said road, thence N. 88 W. 17.00 chains to a stone thence S. 2 1/2 E. to a stone on the road near the home of Emily Jordan, deceased, distance 41.00 chains; thence the road the line to the beginning; bounded by lands of H. P. Cooley, Henry F. Woodson, A. Woodson and W. W. Vinson; being the same tract conveyed to our mother Emily Jordan for life and at her death to her children, Jay John Cooley December 23, 1881; deed recorded in the office of Register Mesnie Conveyance for Greenville County in Book M. M. at page 826.

TOGETHER with, all and singular, the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned unto the said Henry F. Woodson, his heirs and assigns, forever.

AND We do hereby bind ourselves our heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said Henry F. Woodson, his heirs and assigns, against us and our heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
