Long in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said P. R. Long

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being a part of the Subdivision known as "McCullough Heights" and Lot No. Fifty as per plat of said Subdivision made by R. W. Parker, C. E., in 1918, which plat is recorded in R. M. C. office for said County and State, Plat Book E, page 95, reference to which is hereby craved. This conveyance is subject to the following conditions and restrictions: The said property shall be used for residential purposes for white people only (this not to apply to servants), and no residence shall be erected on this lot to cost less than.....

Five thousand and five hundred dollars, and the purchase hereof, his or her heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, shall be amenable to reasonable sanitary rules and regulations as set forth in Deed Colonia Company to Jos. A. McCullough, of date April 28th, 1913, and recorded in R. M. C. office, Vol. 25, page 4.

The above described land is the same conveyed to me by Colonia Company on the 22nd day of October, 1909. Deed recorded in office of Register of Mesne Conveyance for Greenville County, in Book XXX, page 95; and on April 28th, 1913, recorded Vol. 25, page 4.

TOGETHER With all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said P. R. Long, his

heirs and assigns forever. AND I do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said P. R. Long, his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim, the same or any part thereof.
