WHEREAS, W. W. Blount, E. C. Stothart and Frances L. Blount, all of Charleston, South Carolina

did on the first day of February, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Caspary Company of South Carolina

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Charleston, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to sell and distribute in the State of South Carolina the beverage syrup known as "Caspary" manufactured by The Caspary Company of Louisville, Ky. and to be the sole distributors of said syrup in the State of South Carolina, and also to manufacture from Caspary concentrate obtained from said The Caspary Company of Louisville, Ky. a syrup for the manufacture of the beverage known as Caspary and to sell and distribute same in the said State of South Carolina, and also to engage in the general business of manufacturing, selling and distributing beverages, syrups.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. W. Blount as Vice-President E. C. Stothart; as Treasurer, E. C. Stothart; as Secretary, E. C. Stothart

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The News and Courier a newspaper published in the County of Charleston

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

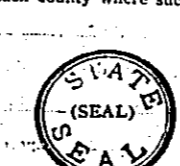
