## Decree of Divorce

McGann appearing on behalf of said plaintiff and there being no appearance upon behalf of said defendant, and it satisfactorily appearing to this court that the material allegations set forth in the plaintiff's bill of complaint are true, and that said defendant has been guilty of the several acts of extreme cruelty therein charged.

On motion of Francis T. McGann, attorney for said plaintiff.

It is ordered, adjudged and decreed and this court by virtue of the authority in it vested doth order, adjudge and decree that the bonds of matrimony now existing between the said Plaintiff and said defendant be dissolved, and the same are hereby dissolved accordingly and said parties to this marriage are, and each of them is, forever freed from the obligations thereof, and a divorce from said bonds of matrimony is hereby awarded and decreed to said Plaintiff, Paul H. Harper.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said Plaintiff, Paul H. Harper, shall pay to said defendant, Emily W. Harper, the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar, which sum shall be accepted by her in lieu of all her dower rights in and to all property of every kind, nature and description whatsoever, now possessed by said Plaintiff, and likewise in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims held by said defendant against said plaintiff.
