Petition of Trustee.

To The Honorable E.M. Blythe, Referee in Bankruptcy: The petition of J.M. Wells respectively shows:

1. Your petitioner is the duly qualified trustee in the above State, and is now acting as such.

2. That a portion of the said bankrupt estate consisting of a one-half interest in the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land situate on the South side of David Street in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at an iron pin on the South side of David Street, -

and thence running along David Street N. 25-1/2 W. 69 feet 3 inches to an iron pin on C.N. David's line; thence along said line S. 57 W. 180 feet to Alton's corner; thence S. 29 E. 70 feet 2 inches to an iron pin on the corner of the Maxwell lot; thence N. 57 E. 176 feet to the beginning corner, being the same lot of land conveyed by W.Z. Ellis unto H.D. Grant, and D.D. Grant on January 10, 1919, deed recorded in Volume 56, page 503, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County.

3. That the one-half interest of H.D. Grant in the above described real estate is incumbered by the following mortgages:

(1) Mortgage for \$7,000.00 given to the Southern Life & Trust Co., recorded in Volume 61, page 231, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County;

(2) Mortgage for \$5,500.00 given to Beulah M. Grant, recorded in Volume 133, page 201, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County.

4. Your petitioner has investigated the value of such property, which was appraised at \$10,000.00 for the entire fee, and believes the same to be of no value to the estate, for the reason that the incumbrances above set forth leave no equity whatever for the bankrupts. Your petitioner believes that it will be to the benefit of the bankrupt estate to disclaim title to such property, and refuse to take the same into possession.

5. Your petitioner alleges that the one-half interest of D.D. Grant has already been released under the terms of a certain composition offered by the said D.D. Grant, and subsequently confirmed by this court.

6. That no previous application has been made to this or any other court for the order hereinafter asked.

Wherefore: your petitioner prays for an order permitting him to disclaim title to such property and to refuse to take the same into his possession.
