the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

J. E. Ammons and his heirs and assigns forever, all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate,

lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin on, and running thence N. 73-1/4 E. 7.00 to stone, Batson's corner; thence N. 74-1/2 E. 25.30 to a stake; thence along the banks of Enoree River 61.54 ods. to a stake; thence S. 47-1/2 W. 6.44 to Hickory X'm; thence S. 16 E. 4.42 to an iron pin; thence S. 33-3/4 E. 5.80 to the beginning corner, and bounded on the North by Enoree River; on the East by Enoree River and on the northwest by James Batson's land, and on the Southwest by L.C. Simmons' land, and containing 41 acres, more or less.


