J. Allen by deed known in P. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 35 at Page 527, and containing 25 acres more or less and also fifty acres devised to M. J. Allen by his father J. C. Allert by will filed for the benefit of probate office of Greenville County, in judgment Book 66 36.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and the remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, dower, possession, property, benefit, claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said M. J. Allen, deceased.
