WHEREAS, A. M. Hayes, Jr. individually and as Executor of the Estate of A. M. Hayes, deceased, plaintiff vs. Mary Pauline Hayes, Dr. M. Hayes, Jr. & Committee for Mary Pauline Hayes, Peoples Notified, Hayes, defendant, on or about the 24th day of December in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one did exhibit his Complaint in the Court of Probate, in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid, for the sale of the Real Estate of A. thirty-two did then, openly and publicly and according to the custom of auctions, sell and dispose of the said real estate described below unto

Union Bleaching for Five Thousand Dollars, being at that price the highest bidder for same.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said

as Judge of the Court of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises, and also in consideration of the sum of

Five Thousand Dollars,

paid me by the said Union Bleaching, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, Have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Union Bleaching and its successors and assigns forever, all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in Greenville Township on the west side of the Buncombe Road, adjoining the property of the Union Bleaching, containing 11.8 acres, more or less and having the following mites and bounds, courses and distances, according to a survey made by Dalton & Nease, Corra, July, 1932.

Beginning at a cast iron monument on the west side of the Buncombe road, corner of property of the granite series, thence along the Buncombe road N. 10° 30' W. 284.6 ft. to an angle, thence along west side of said road N. 2° 6' W. 887 ft. to an angle, thence N. 2° 05' W. 108 ft. to an iron pin on the west side of said road, corner of property now or formerly of C. L. Williams, thence with line of Williams S. 99° 21' W. passing through an iron pipe at 14 feet from said point 360.2 ft. to an iron pipe on the east bank of Reedy River, thence with the meanders of the river a traverse line being as follows: E. 64.2 W. 97 feet to a bend; S. 32° 25' W. 100 feet to a bend; S. 0° 15' W. 105 feet to a bend; S. 24° 16' W. 103 feet to

bend, S. 20° 31' E. 158.4 feet to a cast iron monument on the east bank of Reedy River, thence S. 9° 05' E. crossing river 1,019 feet to a stake, thence N. 11° 20' E. 16- crossing the river 173 feet to a cast iron monument, near the bank of river, thence with the meanders of the river as line a traverse line being as follows: S. 39° 04' E. 89.5 feet to a bend; S. 36° 0' E. 160 feet to a bend; S. 20° 57' E. 235 feet to a bend; S. 43° 0' 3' E. 600 feet to a bend; S. 30° 45' E. 193.8 feet to an iron pipe on the east side of River, corner of other property of the granite series, thence along line of said property N. 48° 55' E. 448.6 feet to a cast iron monument, thence continuing with same property N. 50° 36' E. 1,387.2 feet to the point of beginning.

Subject however, to the right-of-way of Greenville and Northern Railway and to the right-of-way of the Southern Public Utility Co.

The above tract is the same that was conveyed to A. M. Hayes as 119 acres, more or less, by deed recorded in the P. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 25 at page 391.
