

thence S 42-57 E. a distance of 162.5 feet to stake at the intersection of Cagle Street and Maple Street thence with said Maple Street to the corner of lot #2 thence N 42-57 W to a stake a distance of 75 feet to the beginning corner, and being known as Lot #1 of Block "C" recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County, in Plat Book "Z" at page 242.

Also, all that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land situate, lying and being in the city of Greenville, County and State aforesaid and being more particularly described as follows: Being the same lot designated as Lot #2 Block "C" on a Plat of the Cagle and Mauldin property, made by J.
