whom has since died leaving her surviving several children, some of whom are minors; that

one of the children beneficiary under said will is a resident of the State of Texas, another of the State of Georgia and another of the State of North Carolina, and in order to make a division of said estate, it is deemed necessary and expedient to sell the real estate belonging thereto.

Now, therefore, Know all men by these presents;

That, I, Clarence Franklin James, as Executor of the last will and testament of Thomas A. James, deceased, and by virtue thereof, in consideration of the sum of Sixty Seven Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by C. F. James, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said C. F. James, his heirs and assigns, all of that tract of land situate in Chick Springs Township, near Brushy Greek Church in said County and State, adjoining lands of Freeman, Cox, Moltzelaw and others and was the home-place of said Thomas A. James at the time of his death, and is more particularly described as follows:

"Beginning at a point on Brushy Creek at the corner of the J. F. Freeman land and runs thence N. 31 W. 11.00 to an iron pin or near branch; thence N. 33 W. 34.08 to a stone on; thence N. 13.10 E. 15.56 to an iron pin; thence S. 85½ E. 3.63 to an iron pin; thence S. 78.25 E. 10.86 to an iron pin; thence S. 64 E. 13.60 to an iron pin; thence S. 36 R. 3.71, more or less, to an iron pin near school-house; thence S. 954 E. 4.48 to a stone near Brushy Creek Church; thence S. 85½ E. 5.60 to stones; thence S. 10 W. 6.15 to a stake near spring branch by a holly; thence S. 11 W. 10.27 to a poplar 3xcm; thence S. 2 W. 7.50 to a maple 3xcm; near branch; thence 18½ W. 6.25 to stake; thence S. 25½ W. 3.64 to a poplar; thence S. 18½ W. 7.50 to a corner or a creek near mouth of the branch; thence up the meanders of said creek 10.79 to the point of beginning."

Together with all and singular the Rights, Mombers, Hereditaments and

Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or affertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto the said C. F. James his heirs and assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself, my successors, heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Fremises unto the said C. F. James his heirs and assigns, against myself, my successors, and my heirs and so far as I lawfully san do, against every person whomsoever lawfully elaiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
