To have and to held the said bargained premises, together with all and singular the rights, members and appurtenances thereof to the same being, belonging or in anywise appertaining, to the only proper use, benefit and behoof of her, and said Mrs. Comer Young Austin for and during her natural life only.

And the said W. L. M. Austin, Jr, for himself and his heirs, executors and administrators will warrant and forever defend the right and title of the above life estate unto the said Mrs. Comer Young Austin against the lawful claims of all persons whomsever.
