at and before the sealing of these presents by Earle E. Sullivan

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said
Earle E. Sullivan all of our right, title and interest, the same
being an undivided, four-fifths interest, in and to all that piece
of land situate, lying and being in the County
of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the Grounds Hill Road,
and having the following metes and bounds, to wit; according
to a plat made by C. M. Harmon, Jr. July 1925: Beginning at a
red oak tree running thence N. 24° 45' W. 30 chs. to corner; thence
N. 45° 30' E. 36 chs. to corner; thence S. 60° 45' E. 9.30 chs. to a
corner; thence S. 30° 10' E. 30 chs. to corner; thence S. 60° 30' E. 16.60 chs.
to corner; thence N. 30° 10' E. 14 chs. to corner; thence S. 45° W. 35.40
chs. to corner; thence S. 45° W. 3.56 chs. to corner; thence N. 64°
30' E. 35.88 chs. to corner; thence N. 85° W. 5.47 chs. to corner; thence
N. 75° W. 10.70 chs. to corner; thence S. 12° 45' E. 2.72 chs. to corner; thence
S. 74° W. 10.77 chs. to the beginning corner and containing 134.26
acres, and being known as the Gilbreath Tract of land, adjoining
lands formerly of Wilkins, Wood, Kinnear, and others.

1925.
