EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Cassett Williams and George M. Sheer
both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 11th day of February, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
- SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Williams Flying Service, Inc.
- THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to conduct in the
States of South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia,
and such other States as may hereafter
be determined upon, a flying school, called, services,
repair, service, transport, aerial, photography,
sales, advertising, and all other activities relat-
ing to commercial aviation, and any and all
other things which a corporation of this charac-
ter may be authorized to do.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars,

payable 25% cash, balance at the call of the directors
and five hundred shares without par value
SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) shares
without par value and 500 shares of the par value of 100 each.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 4th day of February, 1929,

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:
J. H. Arington, J. C. Furgurson, J. F. Gallina, H. C.
Rice, George M. Sheer, B. W. McMillin, and
Cassett Williams

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Cassett Williams
as Vice-President, J. C. Furgurson, as Secretary, George M. Sheer
as Treasurer, George M. Sheer.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 1100, 2 Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922
and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
