Neal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, about twelve miles north of Greenville City containing 29 1/2 acres, more or less, bounded by the lands of Thomas E. Roe on the west and north and by the lands of Tom Styles and Arthur Hart on the east, and by the lands of Arthur Hart on the south, and being more completely described as follows:

Beginning at the bridge crossing Enoree River and running thence along the Greenville Road in a southern direction 25.67 chains to a stake in the center of said road; thence south 60 1/2 degrees East 23.10 chains to a stone; thence north 13 degrees West 9.78 chains to a stone on bank of road; thence north 43 degrees East 19.88 chains to a stone; thence north 44 degrees East 23.00 chains to a stake; thence north 51 1/2 degrees West 6.80 chains to a stake; thence north 32 3/4 degrees West 3.70 chains to Enoree River; thence up said river as a line 39.50 chains to the beginning corner.
