at and before the sealing of these presents by
J. R. Richardson, the receipt of which is
hereby acknowledged, were agreed, bargained
sold and released, and by these presents
do grant, bargain sell and release unto the
said J. R. Richardson, all and singular, all
my right, title and interest in and to the
premises herein after described individually,
and as trustee for Margaret DuPre, Robt. B.
DuPre and Frances DuPre, all that right
title and interest in and to the premises
herein described as follows:
All that certain lot, parcel or piece of land
situate, lying and being in the town of
Simpsonville, County and State aforesaid:
Beginning at a point of Curtis Street; and
running thence along Curtis Street N. 84-20

E. 105.6 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 5-10 E. 200.
feet along line of lot. May field; thence N. 82-30 E.
165.6 feet along line of lot. May field; thence S. 11 E.
300 feet along Oakland Avenue; thence S. 82-30 E. 182
feet; thence N. 6-40 W. 389 feet along line of estate of Geo.
Jones to the beginning corner, and more particularly
described by reference to a plot of same made
by J. J. Riddle and known as property of J. R.
Richardson and recorded in the office of J. A. M. C.
for Greenville County.
Together with all and singular the rights,
members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the

every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or
to claim the same or any part thereof
