I now all men by these presents, That James Finlay died intestate in the State aforesaid, leaving me, E. J. Finlay, widow, J. T. Finlay and Edward Finlay, son and Hattie M. Finlay, daughter, as his sole heirs at law, and that I, Mrs. E. J. Finlay, widow, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, (\$1.00), and other valuable considerations to me paid by J. T. Finlay, Hattie M. Finlay and Edward Finlay, have granted, bargained, sold, conveyed, released, and quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, convey, release and forever quitclaim unto the said J. T. Finlay, Hattie M. Finlay and Edward Finlay, all my right, title, interest and estate, legal and equitable, in all that parcel and lot of land situated, lying and being in the City and County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, having the following lines, miles and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a stake on the northwest corner of Spring and Coffee Streets, and running with Spring Street three hundred (300) feet more or less, to a stake at the southwest corner of North and Spring Streets; thence with North Street (toward Brown Street), one hundred and sixteen (116) feet, more or less, to the northeast corner of the lot located on the corner of North and Brown Streets, now or formerly owned by Dilley L. Geilly; thence with a line parallel with the first line three hundred (300) feet more or less, to a stake on Coffee Street, and thence with Coffee Street one hundred sixteen (116) feet more or less, to the beginning at a stake on the northwest corner of Spring and Coffee Streets, being all my right, title, interest, and estate, legal and equitable, in all of the lot of land conveyed by Mr. G. C. Goldsmith to James Finlay on July 1st, 1881, as aforesaid recorded in the P. T. C. Office for said County, Vol. M.M. Page 55.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular all of my right, title, interest and estate, legal and equitable, in and to the said premises before mentioned unto the said J. T. Finlay, Hattie M. Finlay and Edward Finlay, their respective heirs and assigns forever.
