This was a motion by the petitioning creditors to vacate the adjudication made herein and to dismiss the petition in bankruptcy heretofores filed by them.

It appears from the record that on July 19, 1928 Arthur J. Fleming and Miles P. Hoffman, by Haynesworth & Haynesworth, Attorneys, filed a petition asking that Jenkins Mill, Inc. be adjudicated bankrupt; thereafter, to wit, on August 13, 1928 said Jenkins Mills was on said petition duly adjudicated bankrupt and the matter was referred to the Referee in Bankruptcy, but no trustee has been appointed and no further proceedings had therein.

On November 6, 1928 the petitioners filed in this Court a petition reciting the foregoing facts and asking that the adjudication be vacated and the petition dismissed.

Thereupon pursuant to the Statute the Clerk of this Court issued a rule requiring all creditors of Jenkins Mill, Inc. to show cause before the District Court of the United States for the Western District of South Carolina at Greenville, in the County of Greenville, in said District, on the 28th day of November, 1928 at ten o'clock A.M., or as soon thereafter as such hearing could be had, why the application of the petitioners should not be granted; said rule requiring further that due notice be given to all creditors of the bankrupt.

Due notice was given to all creditors of such hearing by the publication of the Rule in "The Greenville Daily News," as required by law and by mailing a copy of said rule to each of the creditors named in the list of creditors annexed to the petition, on which said application is based.

It appearing that no creditor so served with said Order has appeared and no creditor has made any objection to the vacating of said adjudication and dismissal of said petition, now on motion of Haynesworth & Haynesworth, Attorneys for Petitioners, it is

Ordered that the adjudication in bankruptcy heretofores signed on August 13, 1928 be, and the same is hereby, vacated and set aside and the petition herein filed on the 19th day of July, 1928 be, and the same is hereby dismissed.
