I know All Men By These Presents, that
Wateree Power Company, a corporation duly organ-
ized and existing under and by virtue of the
laws of the State of South Carolina, for and in
consideration of the sum of Five (\$5) Dollars and
other valuable considerations to it in hand paid
by Duke Power Company, a corporation duly
organized and existing under and by virtue
of the laws of the State of New Jersey, at and
before the signing and sealing of these presents,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,
has granted, bargained, sold, released, set over,
and delivered, and by these presents does grant,
bargain, sell, release, set over, and deliver unto
Duke Power Company, its successors and assigns,
all those lands, rights, privileges, easements, and
properties lying and being in the Counties of
Spartanburg, Laurens, and Greenville, State of
South Carolina, and more particularly bounded
and described as follows:

1. All and singular those several pieces,
parcels, and tracts of land situate on both
sides of Enoree River in Spartanburg and Laurens
Counties, about one mile south of Crescent Post
Office and four and one-half miles west of Wood-
ruff, South Carolina, known as the Van Patton
Shoals property and having the following courses
and distances:

Beginning at a stone on the east bank
of Enoree River, on the line between the property
of Mrs. C. W. Garrett and Enoree Power Company,
and running thence N. 21-15 E. 5130 feet to a
pipe in an old Hickory stump; thence S. 46-45

stone; thence S. 59-0 W. 171.6 feet to cedar tree;
thence S. 38-0 W. 147.8 feet to stake; thence S. 27-0 W.
489.7 feet to stake; thence S. 52-45 W. 272 feet to
sweet gum; thence N. 64-0 W. 103.6 feet to stake;
thence N. 50-0 W. 436.9 feet to sweet gum; thence N.

74-45 W. 396 feet to walnut on the dividing line
between B. F. Land R. T. Newman; thence S. 13-0 W.
71.3 feet to stone; thence S. 31-0 E. 318.7 feet to stone;
thence S. 7-45 E. 165 feet to stone; thence S. 32-45
E. 112.2 feet to stone; thence S. 11-0 E. 132 feet to
stone; thence S. 8-0 W. 165 feet to stone; thence
S. 18-0 E. 429 feet to stone; thence S. 11-45 W.
264 feet to stone; thence S. 33-0 W. 165 feet to
stone; thence S. 22-0 W. 207.9 feet to white oak
tree; thence S. 25-15 W. 339.2 feet to persimmon
tree; thence S. 6-45 E. 534.6 feet to white oak
tree; thence S. 33-30 E. 561 feet to stake; thence
S. 47-30 W. 138.6 feet to iron wood tree; thence
S. 81-0 W. 363 feet to stake; thence S. 70-45 W.
155.1 feet to holly tree; thence S. 85-0 W. 56 feet
to stake on old lime; thence S. 6-30 E. 23.1 feet
to stone on bank of Enoree River; thence down
and across Enoree River 810 feet to mouth of
branch on West side of river; thence up said
branch the following Courses and distances:
South 462 feet; thence S. 3-0 E. 435.6 feet; thence
S. 23-0 W. 132 feet; thence S. 2-15 W. 330 feet; thence
S. 15-0 W. 297 feet; thence S. 11-30 W. 363 feet; thence
S. 58-45 W. 171.6 feet; thence S. 26-15 W. 360.4 feet to stone
on branch; thence S. 47-0 E. 161 feet to stone on
old road; thence N. 46-0 E. down old road to turn;
thence N. 40-0 E. to stone and cedar tree, the latter
two courses being 1,000 feet; thence S. 66-0 E. 21.00
feet to pipe; thence N. 48-30 E. 1165 feet to pipe
corner at end of old rock dam; thence across
said river and up the east bank thereof to
beginning stone: containing 439.6 acres, more
or less, according to survey and plat recorded
in the office of the Clerk of Court for Laurens
County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 48, pages
520 et seq.

Save and Except, however, from the above
described lands a tract containing 7.6 acres
shown on said plat as the property of Cedar
Grove Baptist Church.

The above described lands are bounded
on the North by lands of Phillips, Jones, B. F.
Newman, R. T. Newman, and others; on the
East by Mrs. C. W. Garrett; on the South by
Turner, Coker, Pearson, and others; and on the
West by Coker, R. T. Newman, and others.
