(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said May Hightower for and during her natural life and after her death to Bobbie Hightower and Mabel Hightower, their Heirs and assigns forever. All that piece parcel or lot of land in Paris Mt. Township Greenville, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being tract No. 64 of the Parker Land Company shown on Plat No. 2 of the Parker Land Company, surveyed and Platted by A. S. Bedell, April 1924, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of the Parker Road, the northeast corner of tract #55, and in the line of tract #54, and running thence with the line of tract No. 55, S. 64-30 W. 1247.4 feet to a point in the center of the Poor House Branch, the corner of tract No. 55 in the line of tract No. 53; and running thence with the line of tract No. 53, and thence with the line of tract No. 63, and the meanderings of the Poor House branch in a general direction N. 16-30 E. 290 feet to the corner of tracts Nos. 53 and 68; thence still with the center of the Poor House Branch and with the line of tract 68 in a general direction N. 39-20 E. 876.0 feet to a point in the line of tract No. 68, thence still with the meanderings of the said branch and the line of tract 68 in a general direction N. 60-44 E. 347 feet to a point in the branch, in the center of the Parker Road a corner of tract Nos. 68 and 64; thence with the center of the Parker Road and the line of tract No. 64, S. 28-30 E. 537.5 feet to the beginning point. Beginning at a point in the center of Poor House Branch, under the bridge, in the center of the Parker Road, same being the corner of tracts Nos. 71, 64, 54, and 68; thence with center of the Parker Road the following courses and distances with the line of tract No. 70 N. 35-30 W. 0-70 chs., thence N. 45-6 W. 4.09 chs.; thence N. 39-20 W. 2.72 chs.; thence N. 50-45 W. 2.08 chs. to the corner of tracts Nos. 69 and 63; thence with the center of the Perry Road and line of tract 63 the following courses and distances: S. 39-30 W. 1.90 chs.; thence E. 2.61 chs.; thence S. 19-46 W. 2.59 chs.; thence S. 29-16 W. 5.70 chs.; thence S. 61-6 W. 3.30 chs. to the northeast corner of tract No. 63; thence with the line of tract 63 S. 47 E. 4.50 chs. to a point in the center of the Poor House branch, in the line of tract No. 64; thence with the center of the Poor House branch and the line of tract No. 64, the following courses and distances: N. 37-30 E. 7.00 chs. thence N. 40 E. 4.14 chs.; thence N. 81 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 4.13 chs. to the beginning corner, and being known as tract No. 63 on Plat No. 2 of the Parker Land Company, containing 7.7 acres, more or less, and being the same land conveyed to Ben G.
