HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, TO GRANT, convey and release unto the said H. E. Blumablee,

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land  
situate in Brick Springs Township, Greenville County,  
South Carolina, and being on what is known as  
St. Mark Road and being designated as Lot No. 3,  
as shown on plat made by J. Earle Freeman Octo-  
ber 10, 1935. And having the following metes and  
bounds, to wit:

Beginning at a point in center of St. Mark  
Road, corner of J. L. McConnell lot (Lot No. 2); thence  
N. 76 1/4 E. 257 1/2 feet to iron pin; thence S. 67 E. 207 feet  
to iron pin; corner of Lot No. 4; thence S. 89 3/4 W. 172 1/2  
feet to iron pin; thence S. 66 W. 225 feet to a point
